Background and Context

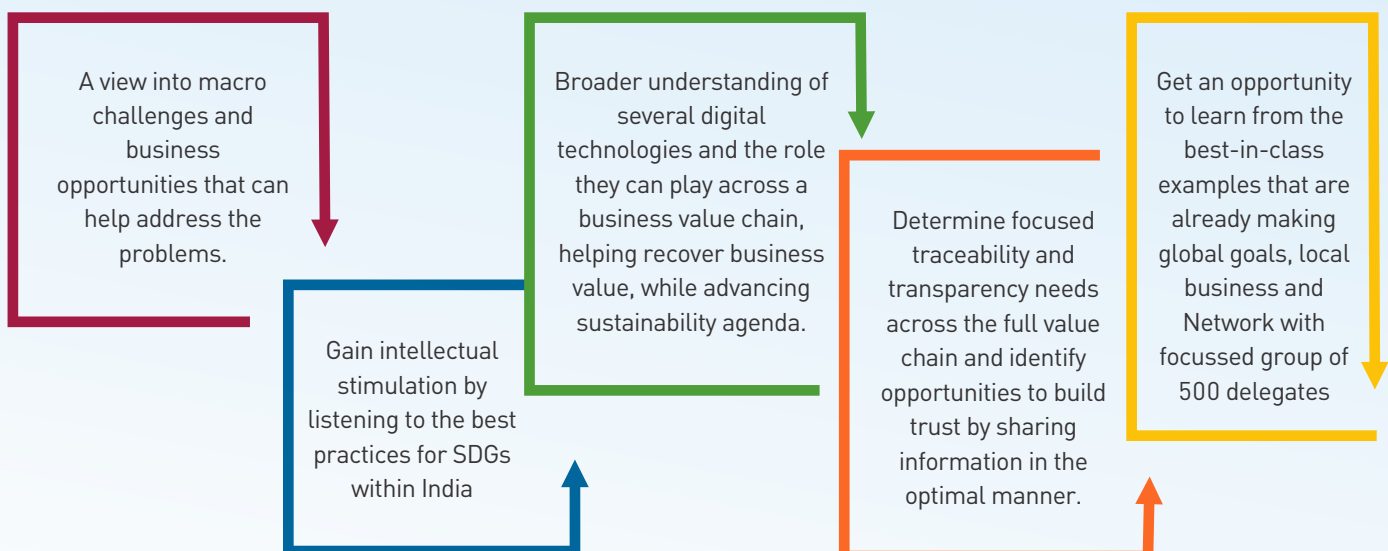
The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) also known as Global Goals were formally adopted by 193 member nations of the UN in September 2015 and are expected to tackle the world's biggest problems by 2030 by empowering people, driving prosperity, protecting planet, fostering peace and nurturing global.

The SDGs were charted on the strong foundation of the Millennium Development Goals. Given the rampant rate at which complexities were mounting in the world, a broader and more comprehensive agenda was called for. They encompass a wide range of global issues with underlying targets directing signatories to imbibe the goals in their way of operations. What sets SDGs apart is their emphasis on leveraging partnerships between public and private enterprises to drive the agenda forward.

About the 12th National Convention

Recognising these imperatives, UN Global Compact Network India organises every year its flagship event National Convention. Rotated round the country, this year, at New Delhi the National Convention, 12th in its series on 28th April 2017, assumes greater significance as it is coinciding with UN Global Conference being hosted by UN GCNI on 26-27 April 2017 in New Delhi. This year, the theme of the Convention is "Making Global Goals Local Business" which revolves around the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), especially how the corporate sector is contributing/can contribute towards the achievement of some of these ambitious goals. There is a broad consensus that governments on their own will not be able to meet these goals. However, there are key roles that government departments and agencies need to play to ensure that businesses can operate efficiently to meet these goals. The objective will be to highlight major challenges that India face in the current times, and ways in which businesses can create shared value that drives mainstream business agenda for them while creating a positive social impact.

Global Compact Network India (GCNI), formed in November 2000, was registered in 2003 as a non-profit society to function as the Indian Local Network of the UN Global Compact, New York. It is the first Local Network in the world to be established with full legal recognition. It also as a country level platform for businesses, civil society organisations, public and private sector, aids in aligning stakeholders' responsible practices towards the Ten Universally Accepted Principles of UNGC in the areas of Human Rights, Labour, Environment and Anti-corruption, broad UN goals including Sustainable Development Goals and other key sister initiatives of the United Nations and its systems.

At present, the India Network ranks among the top 10, out of more than 103 Local Networks in the world. It has also emerged as the largest corporate sustainability initiative in India and globally with a pan India membership of 252 leading business and non-business participants and 350 signatories, strengthening their commitment to the UN Global Compact Principles by becoming proud members of the Local Network in India.
